COURSE NO., HOURS, AND TITLE:

RAD415, 3, Research Methods

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will introduce the student to the various mechanisms by which scholarly and professional research are conducted. These include quantitative and qualitative methodologies, historiographical, and a mixed methods approach.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 3. Identify the various means of concluding scholarly research;
- 4. Identify appropriate means of analysis to be utilized in evaluating research.
